




THIS WAS THE FIRST REPRESENTATIVE ASSEMBLY OF LAW-MAKERS IN AMERICA.




LINCOLN








WORKING AT HUMBLE JOBS BY DAY, LINCOLN TAUGHT HIMSELF LAW BY NIGHT. FTER OPENING A LAW OFFICE IN SPRINGFIELD, HE ENTERED POLITICAL LIFE... AND IN 1858 BECAME A






HE BECAME A TELEGRAPHER FOR A RAILROAD ... AND ROSE TO SUPERINTENDENT. WITH SAVINGS, HE PURCHASED A SMALL IRON BUSINESS...WENT TO ENGLAND TO STUDY THE BEGSEMER PROCESS OF TURNING IRON INTO STEEL.

IN 1873, AGED 38, HE STARTED HIS OWN STEEL COMPANY.

WITHIN 10 YEARS...





SEMEMBERING HIS OWN STRUGGLE FOR EDUCATION, HE GAVE MILLIONS FOR PUBLIC LIBRARIES, FOR A GREAT TECHNICAL INSTITUTE, FOR A WORLD PEACE ORGANIZATION...HE DID INDEED REPAY HIS ADOPTED LAND.

SUT MANY PEOPLE OPPOSED THE CONCENTRATION OF ECONOMIC POWER REPRESENTED BY CARNEGIE'S STEEL, OR BY JOHN D. ROCKEPELLER'S OIL. A LAW, CALLED THE ANTI-TRUST ACT, WAS PASSED IN 1890 TO PREVENT MONOPOLY OF AN INDUSTRY BY ANY ONE GROUP.

MEANWHILE, ANOTHER ECONOMIC FORCE WAS GROWING ... THAT OF ORGANIZED LABOR.





FOR 38 YEARS, GOMPERS GUIDED THE A.F. of L....THROUGH STRIKES AND DEPRESSIONS. TO DAYS OF STRENGTH AND PROSPERITY.

E BECAME A LABOR ADVISER TO PRESIDENTS ... AND ALWAYS HIS GOAL WAS LABOR'S WELFARE ... THROUGH PARTNERSHIP!

FARMERS, TOO, WERE BANDING TOGETHER. THEIR UNIONS, OR"GRANGES," LED TO THE POPULIST PARTY (1890) WHICH URGED MANY REFORMS: FAIR PRICES FOR CROPS, AN B-HOUR WORKING DAY, FREE COINAGE OF SILVER. THEIR CHAMPION WAS





BECAME LAWS.



THUS, FROM ATIME OF ECONOMIC UPHEAVAL, A NEW CONCEPT SLOWLY EMERGED, REPLACING THE DELUSION OF CLASS STRUGGLE WITH THE VISION OF A DYNAMIC SOCIETY IN WHICH ALL MEN WOULD BE PARTNERS.


