

Wonderful Lamp*

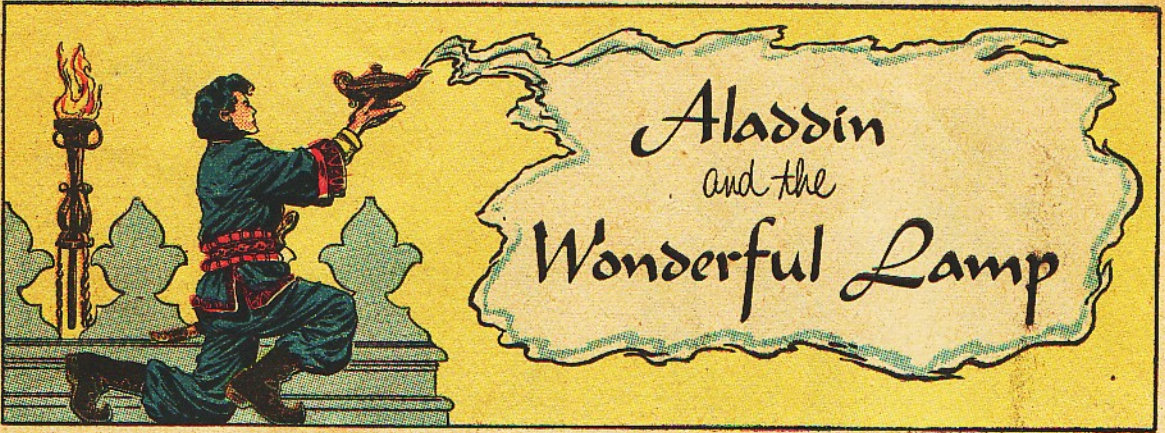

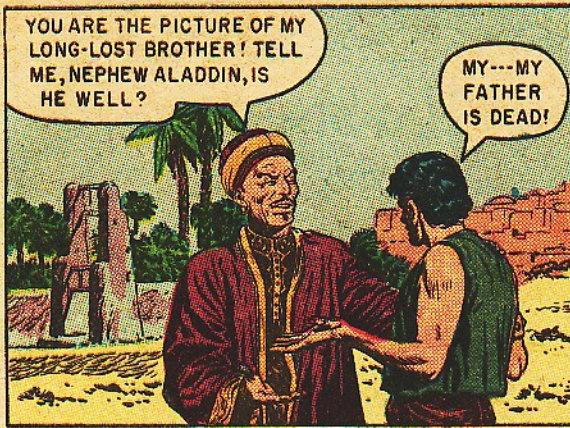

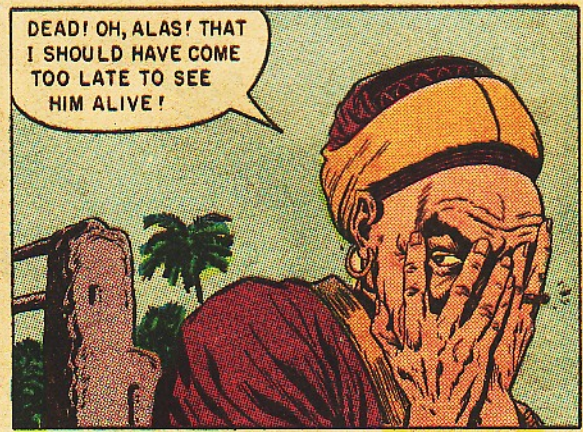

DEAD! OH, ALAS! THAT I SHOULD HAVE COME TOO LATE TO SEE HIM ALIVE!

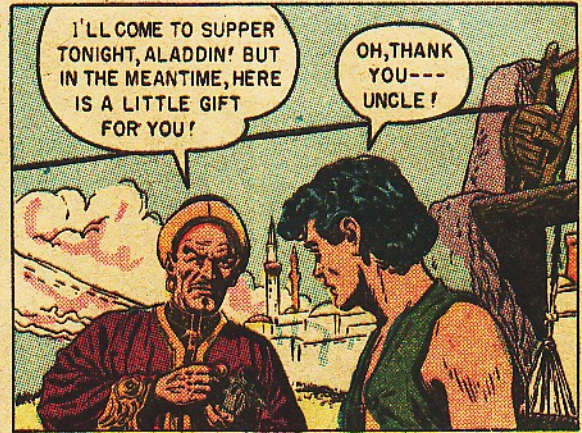

NO! NO! I FEEL TOO SAD TO MEET HER NOW!

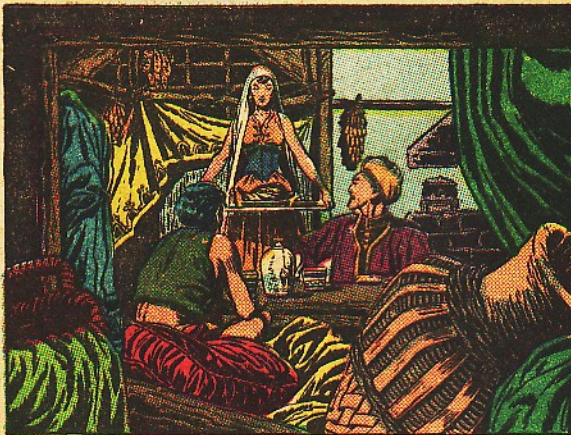

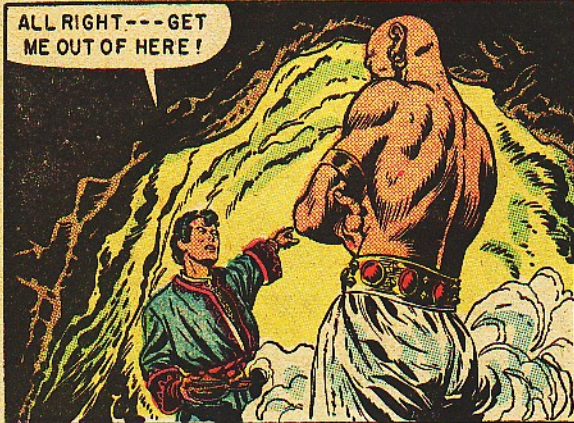
BECAUSE HE HAD NOTHING ELSE TO DO, ALADDIN RUBBED THE TEAR SPOT OFF THE LAMP---



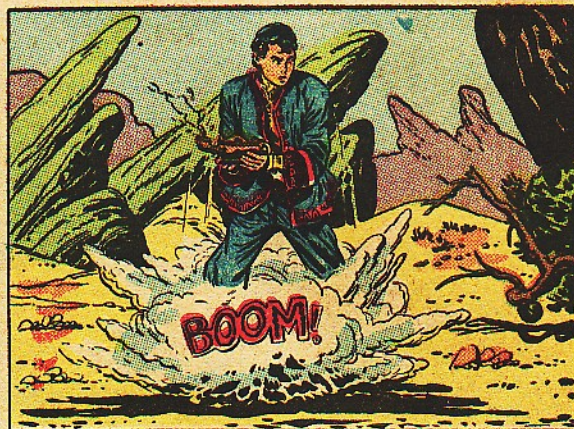

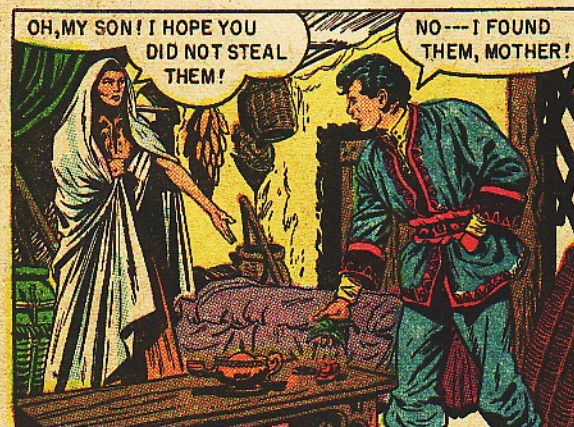

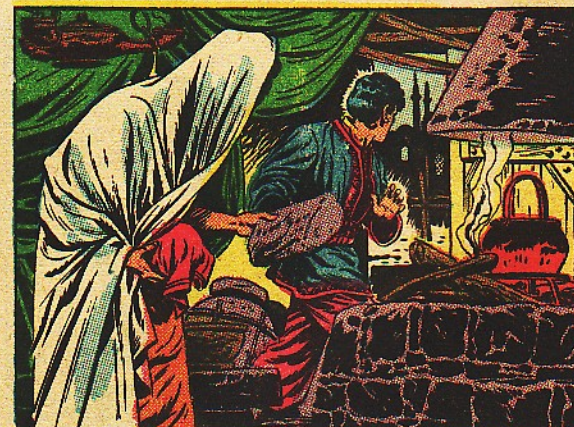

ALADDIN WAS NOT FRIGHTENED AT ALL, THIS TIME. HE GAVE THE GENIE A QUICK COMMAND.



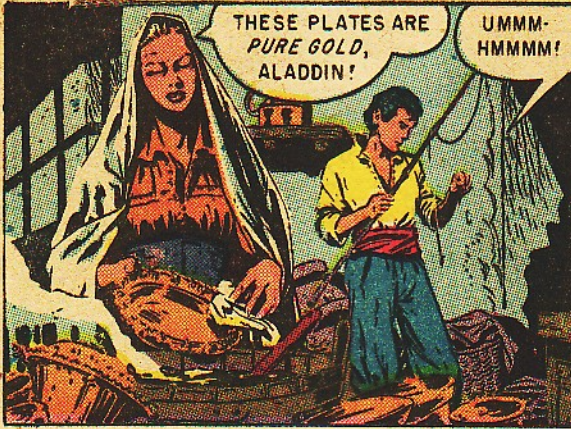

THE POOR LADY WAS TOO ASTONISHED TO SAY A WORD, AT FIRST



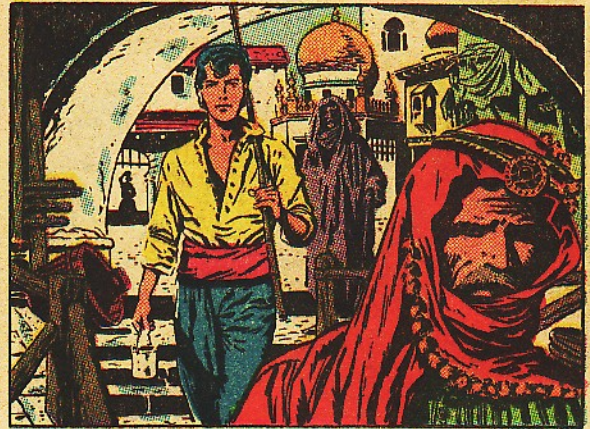

HE PEEKED THROUGH THE BUSHES, AND SAW---



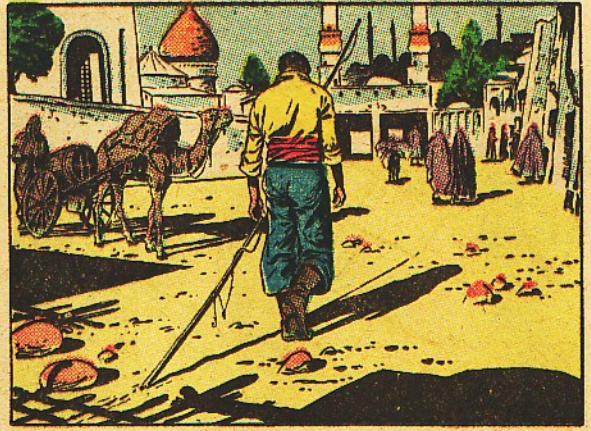

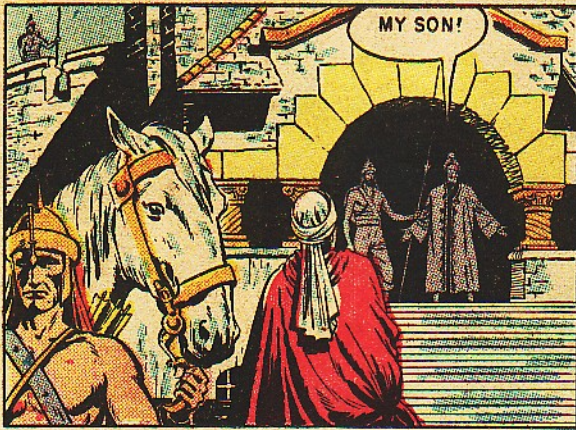
A MAGNIFICENT PALACE STOOD WHERE THE OLD SHACK HAD BEEN. THE

HIS NEW PALACE ---



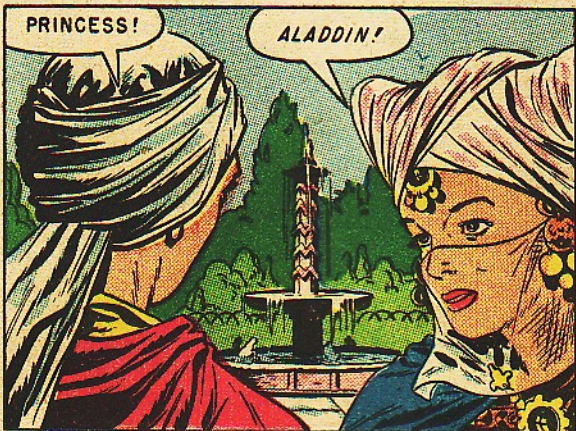
--- AND RODE THROUGH THE CITY, AS A RED VELVET

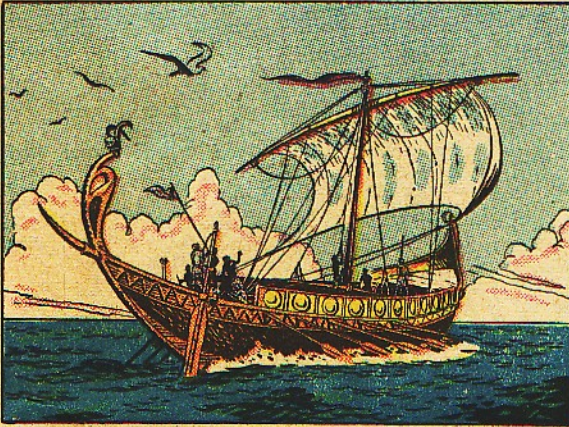
ARRGH! IT CAN'T BE---ALADDIN? BUT IT IS?!

HE WAS BOUND, AND MARCHED INTO THE THRONE ROOM WHERE THE KING WAS WAITING FOR HIM.



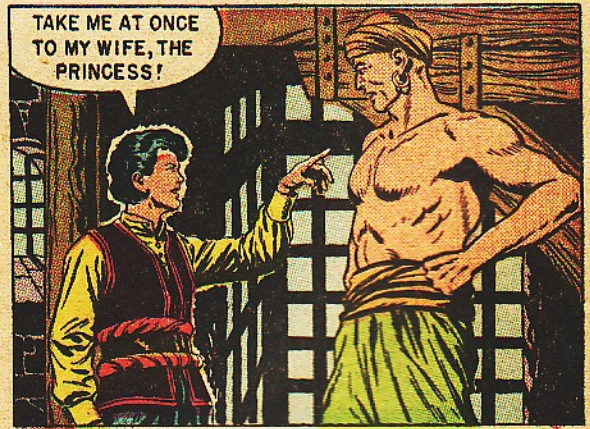

And do not play at anything.

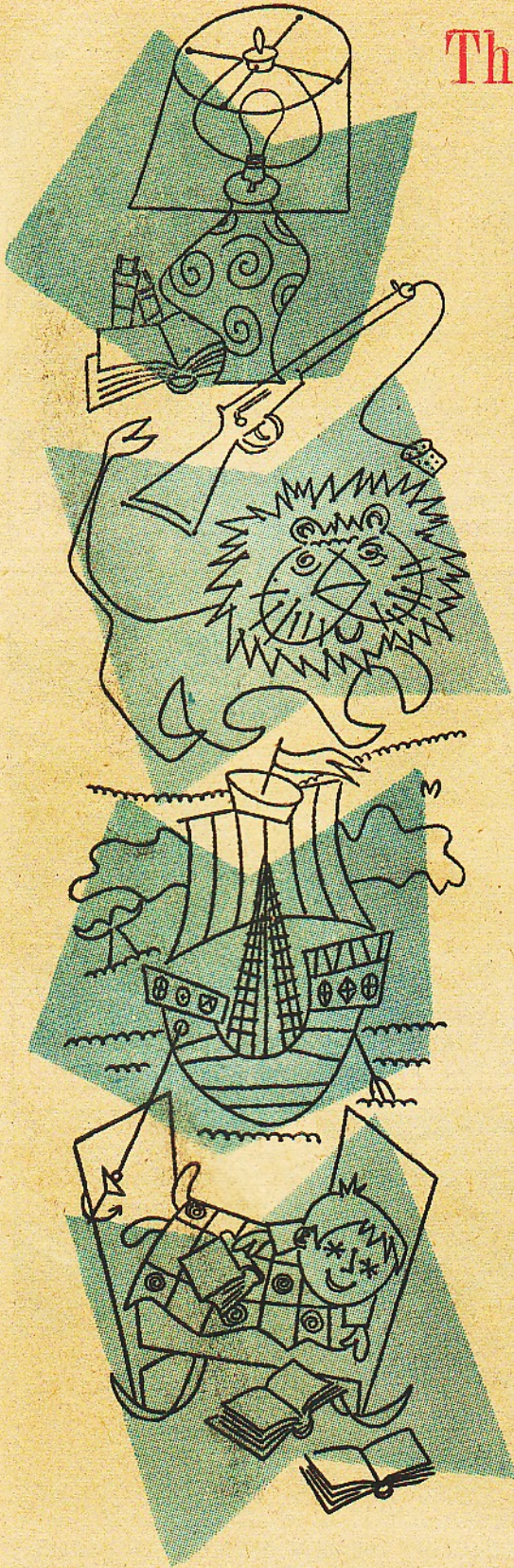
Now, with my little gun, I crawl
