HENRY RIDER HAGGARD

COUNTRY gentleman, adventurer, political reformer, successful novelist . . . Henry Rider



Haggard, author of "She." resembled more than anything one of his own swashbuckling heroes, Throughout the last half of the nineteenth century, this successful author wrote some twenty-eight popu-

lar books, the best of which show the same skillful admixture of fantasy and adventure that have made "She" a classic. Some of the best of these other works include "King Solomon's Mines," "Ayesha," a sequel to "She," "Alan Quatermain," "Jess," and "People of the Mist."

It is no accident that so many of these adventurous stories have an African setting. Although born in Bradenham Hall, Norfolk, England, Rider, Haggard went to Africa when he was only nineteen as secretary to Sir Henry Bulwer, governor of Natal. It was the first of many visits to the Dark Continent, and although he ultimately settled in his native England to pursue a literary career, his heart was always in the strange wild land he found so fascinating as a youth.

Yes, Rider Haggard was certainly a curious combination of adventurer, crusader and statesman. In the course of his colorful career he found time to participate in the Boer War and to run for office as a Member of Parliament.

In those whose hearts never grow old, whose own imaginations are ready to leap to unexplored heights, Rider Haggard will always find a reading public. The color, the breathless action, the wide roaming fantasies of his books will strike a sympathetic chord in generations still unborn. Like "She," herself, the stories have in them the germ of immortality.

"THE DARK CONTINENT"

AFRICA, land of burning deserts, steaming jungles, mystery and death has been aptly called the Dark Continent. Throughout its long and

bloody history, stretching as it does back to the very thresholds of time, this huge foreboding body of land has always beckoned to the explorer, the adventurer, the type of men whose restless spirits seek out danger.

For centuries before Europe was anything more than a forest peopled with barbarians, the lands of Northern Africa had cradled civilization. Many bloody wars have been fought on its soil. The sands of North Africa have known the tread of countless invaders from the sandalled feet of armored Phoenecian warriors and Roman legions to the hobnailed boots of Nazis, English Tommies and American C.I.'s.

But the southern half of Africa is the real home of mystery. Separated from North Africa, as it is, by boundless deserts and jungles, it remained unexplored by white men until comparatively recent times. So far as is known, no white man had ventured there until about the time of the discovery of America during the age of exploration. Even then,

the few hardy adventurers who dared the hardships of this wild land were able to do little to conquer it. It was not until early in the last century that European missionaries began to penetrate the jungles in the hope of converting its wild inhabitants to Christianity.

One of the best-known of these men was Dr. David Livingstone, who, in 1849, crossed the Kalahari Desert from south to north and reached Lake Ngami. It was he who first discovered and reported the great Victoria Falls which are larger than Niagara Falls.

In 1869 rich diamond fields were discovered in South Africa and a great rush of European immigrants to this area began. From that time on the Dark Continent gave up its secrets one by one to the explorers and fortune hunters who are always the advance guard of civilization.



"THE CIVILIZATION OF ANCIENT EGYPT"

NE of the most fantastic and appealing things about the story "She" is the ancient civilization it describes. Actually, however, the details of this civiliza-



tion are far from the realm of fantasy. They are more nearly a literal description of the civilization of Ancient Egypt.

Among the oldest and yet most advanced civilizations known, ancient Egypt was originally called Kemi-the Black Land. Sinister as this sounds, undoubtedly it referred to the rich black soil of the land rather than to any mystery or evil of the times. Actually, the people of this civilization were neither fierce nor cruel, but patient, hard working folk who despised all foreign lands and ways. That they had reason for their contempt, there can be little doubt, for while a great part of the rest of the world was living in superstitious savagery, the Egyptians had built for themselves a culture and a science that is only now being fully appreciated. Their astronomers knew far more than the European star-gazers who followed them by three or four thousand, years. In fact, there are many who believe that we are just beginning to learn more of the universe than was known by these early people.

For example, the Great Pyramid, one of the seven wonders of the ancient

world, is a remarkable monument to ancient Egyptian science. It is an amazing fact that the location of the pyramid seems to have been chosen because it is the mathematical center of the land area of the earth! How these early people were able to determine this remains one of the great unsolved mysteries of science.

Because, in their religion, the Egyptians believed their dead lived on in earthly bodies, elaborate means of embalming were developed by them. Everyone knows and marvels at the existence, after so many centuries, of well-preserved Egyptian mummies, yet the methods by which they were embalmed represented one of the most jealously guarded secrets of all time and even today it remains an unsolved mystery.

So much of the Ancient Egyptian culture baffles us, even today, that a whole new branch of science, Egyptology, has sprung up with no other purpose than to unravel the history of their great culture. Much has been learned by our Egyptologists, yet as each new fact is uncovered



and catalogued, the mystery only seems to deepen.

No wonder this land was called Kemi—the Black Land, for black is the color of mystery! And mystery is the name for Ancient Egypt!
