IN THE DAYS OF KNIGHTS

So many readers have been writing in to ask about medieval customs—and to compliment us on our instructive text about those days—that we are encouraged to continue. Customs, manners, clothes, food, weapons: all these and more you will learn about in The Days of Knights. . . .

castle or manor ground,
the merchant, the travel-

ling peddler or tinker: these were the ones who worked. The nobles of medieval days, the knights and the women of the upper classes did no work at all.

The working day was long and hard in those times. There was no five o'clock whistle, no vacation. Men worked and worked hard, at the whims of their lord. If he was easygoing, they were lucky. What kind of work did they do? First of all, they hunted and fished for food, because that was the most important thing in their lives. This could be considered relaxing - but if the hunter failed to get game or fish, the lord would not eat, and the peasant would be punished. Hunting and fishing, or anything else for that matter, is fun only if we do not have to do it! They used bows and arrows, crossbows, spears to hunt. Sometimes a blowgun was used.

Almost as important as the hunting and fishing was the gardening, for this too produced food. All manner of fruit, lettuce, beets, cabbage, cucumbers, were raised.

Then there were the builders, serfs or peasants who could use tools well. These built the necessary sheds and houses needed to keep the castle or manor house functioning properly. Saws, hammers and adzes were their most popular tools. They notched beams to fit together and hammered in crude iron nails. Most of the houses and castles were without glass windows in the early part of the Middle Ages. Only the rich could afford them. These carpenters also made the chests and beds and strong chairs that was the furniture of the times.

At harvest time the peasants gathered to bring in the produce from the lord's fields. Though many of them owned their own land, the serfs were obliged by feudal custom to spend so many days a week in helping their overlord. In return for this, he offered them protection.

Others who were often seen in the medieval scene were the tinkers and peddlers who went from town to town and castle to castle with their wares. Mummers and mimes—actors and singers—also

went travelling about, performing little plays and folklore tales for the people in the castle or the village.

The large towns and cities were expanding, too. Trade between countries by ship and caravan were making men rich. The guilds were formed. Rivers too were busy as boats plied up and down them with goods for sale or barter.

Weights and measures and a way of figuring costs and expenses began to take on importance. The abacus provided a clumsy means of counting out profits or losses. The Crusades opened the eyes of Europe to the fact that Arabian numerals (the 1 to 10 system we use today) were a tremendous improvement over the old Roman numerals.

All in all, the Middle Ages was a time of transition in labor, as it passed through a period of slavery under Roman rule to serfdom.

THE HOLY GRAIL Many stories have been written about the Holy Grail. It was the shining goal that blazed before King Arthur and his knights, of whom only Sir Galahad was deemed worthy to find the Grail. But—what was the Grail?

In simple terms, it was the cup out of which Christ and His apostles drank during the Last Supper, Deeply religious as were all people of the Middle Ages, the knights of the Round Table travelled far and wide to find it. Only Sir Galahad succeeded.

In 1910, in Antioch, a silver chalice was found in a dry well. There was a small cup inside it, of obvious antiquity. The silver chalice seemed made to hold the cup. Scholars and antiquarians said—hesitantly—this small cup was the Holy Grail! Most readers have seen the movie, The Silver Chalice, or read the best seller of that name. Now—at last—there seems to be actual proof to substantiate the story! Those knights of the Round Table knew what they were doing, after all!

THEIR GEOGRAPHY Little was known of the world the people of the middle ages lived in. The old maps that have been found would be un-

recognizable by any modern schoolboy.

of those old days did not know of North and South America, or Australia. China they knew about only after Marco Polo went there in the years 1269-1275. Silk caravans from China made their way to Bagdad and Damascus, of course, but information like this was not well known in Europe.

On some old maps, the Garden of Eden is shown! Also a tall building called the Tower of Babel! Strange animals and men, like the unicorn and centaur, were believed to have lived in the heart of Africa. Monsters and queer beings decorate these maps in places that would otherwise be marked unexplored.

One value these incorrect maps did have, however: they interested people. This stimulation for knowledge resulted, in 1492, in a man named Christopher Columbus sailing westward to find India. He found the new world, America, instead

THE MIDDLE AGES People speak of the middle ages and medieval times, but many do not know what they were, other than the fact that knights were bold and ladies fair, and jousting and chivalry were at their peak. Of recent years, the movies, with Ivanhoe and Knights of the Round Table, have popularized the period.

The Middle Ages generally are regarded as that period of time between 400 AD and 1500 AD. When Rome fell, in 410 AD the organization of cultures and the one world they created died away. The period from 400 to about 1000 AD were known as the "dark ages," when men lived in a kind of semi-civilized barbarism.

From 1000 AD until 1500 AD (which saw the birth of the Renaissance), the Crusades expanded the world for Europe, people entered into that period of knighthood and chivalry which we look upon as medieval times.

Thus the middle ages are comprised of two parts, the dark ages, and the age of knighthood. We hope this will give you a better insight into the time during which the tales of Robin Hood and Sir Galant are written.

THEIR CHURCHES It was during the age of knighthood that the great cathedrals of Europe were built. The cathedral of Notre Dame was erected 1163-1240, the cathedral of Reims between 1212 and 1300. Other great cathedrals were the churches at Ulm, built with the Bavarian gold of the rich merchants, in 1377, St. Mark's of Venice with its famous horses in gilded bronze and Gothic carvings, built

in the eleventh and twelfth centuries, the cathedrals of Wells in England and Bourges in France. The English church was constructed in the thirteenth century, the Bourges cathedral in the twelfth.

The architectural details of these cathedrals rank high in the world of art. Almost everyone has seen pictures of the famous Notre Dame cathedral with its great spire and twin towers. Its rose window and facade carvings in the interior are acknowledged masterpieces.

Ulm cathedral is noted for the sculptures which depict stories from the Bible with which we are all familiar, as well as the wooden statues of the saints which are set near shrines and choir stalls.

St. Mark's of Venice is Byzantine in detail, with Arabian alabaster, porphyry pillars from Egypt, Greek marbles, as part of its construction. Its several domes give it an oriental appearance. Golden mosaics decorate its inner walls.

Wells cathedral is fitted with statues of well-known men in the history of the church and of England. Its stained glass windows and rib-vaulted ceilings, its inverted arches and Gothic traceries give it an ethereal look despite the heavy stone of which it is constructed.


The cathedral at Bourges is credited with having the finest stained-glass windows in the world. Ancient relics and beautiful statues give it a magnificence that takes the breath away.

Many people of today ask: how did the people of five to eight hundred years ago build such wonderful edifices?

In the Middle Ages, the church was intimately bound up with the lives of the people. Its lavish ceremonies were attractions, and people came from far and near to participate in them. Remember, there were no organized sports, no radio, no movies, no television. The church played the part of entertainer as well as guide and counsellor in religious matters. People gave to their churches with free hands, and worked to help make their church the most lovely one of all.

That they succeeded in this is attested by the fact that these many centuries later all the world marvels at their skill.


